Once the girls had grown and left home John and Pat had the chance to travel. They visited Asia, England, Scotland, Wales Europe, New Zealand, Fiji, many parts of Australia, and some wonderful times in Paris, the Riviera, Italy, Venice, Austria, Switzerland and Amsterdam.

Cruising was another delight they enjoyed together and the pair enjoyed 7 cruises together.

One of John's greatest achievements besides his wonderful family was the growing of prize winning orchids. His green thumb in this area saw him win many ribbons.

Pat's passing in 2014 was difficult for John. He was caring for Pat, followed the Doctors instructions to the letter and her sudden passing left him shattered. But he forged on so strongly for the family he loved.
