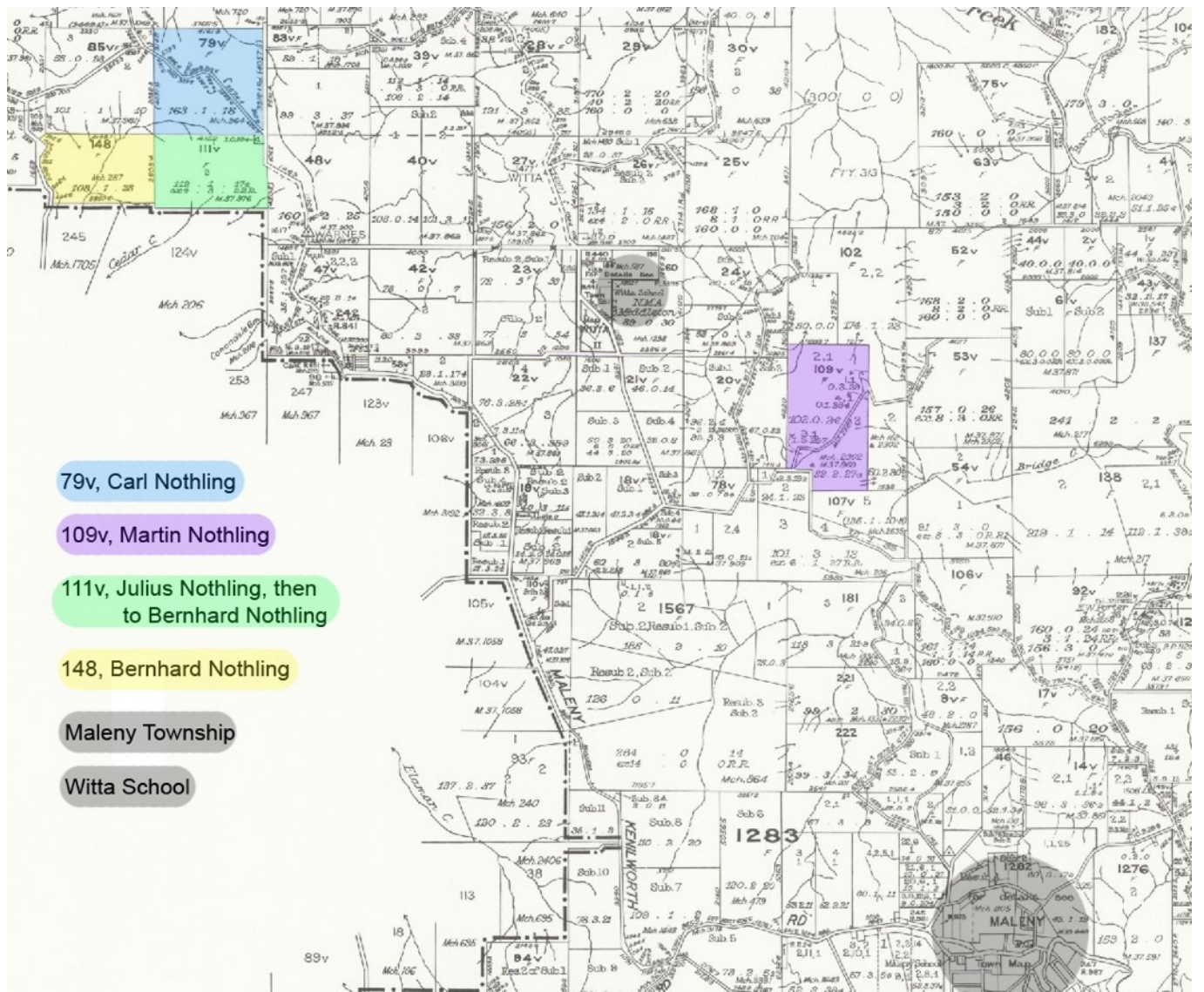


Carl Nothling

It's 151 years since the birth of Martin Julius Carl Nothling on 30 January 1873 in Berlin, Germany. Known as Carl (or the anglicised Charles), he was a younger son of Emilie and Julius Nothling. Sailing into Brisbane in 1880, the Nothling family settled in Beenleigh. Between 1887-1905, Julius and his three sons (Martin, Carl, and Bernhard) selected land NW of the current Maleny Township. However, due to various difficulties, some of the land was forfeited.

Carl and Isabella Sarah Jane Bryce married in Brisbane in 1907. They received a "tin-kettling" on their return to his farm at Curramore (Portion 79v, Parish of Maleny). Carl had a strong interest in community affairs. He was a Maleny Butter Factory director, Justice of the Peace, on the District Council of Agriculture (Maroochy) committee, secretary of the local Qld Farmers' Union, and a Landsborough Shire Council councillor. A dairy farmer for more than 40 years, Carl died in 1939 after an operation in the Maleny Hospital. He was buried in the Witta Cemetery.

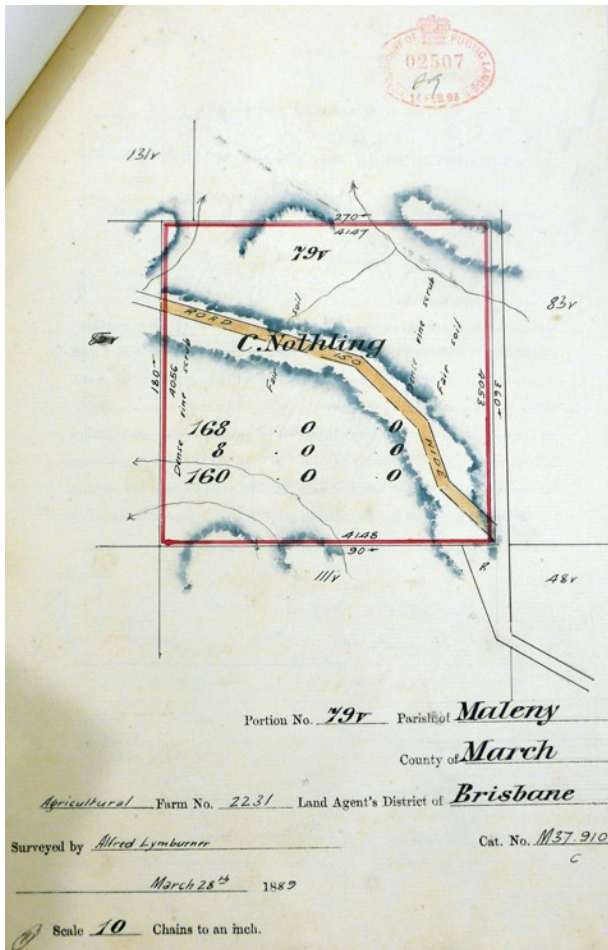
