

## Henry (Harry) Frank Warne

Henry Frank Warne (known as Harry) was born 30 November 1893. Youngest son of Charlotte and Frank Warne (two of Witta's earliest European settlers), he enlisted during WWI and sent home a pair of gloves captured from a German officer's dug-out in the second line trenches at Pozieres in northern France. His name is recorded on the Witta Honour Board, the Maleny Hospital Honour Board, and the Landsborough Shire Honour Scroll.

The following is Harry's entry in "Queenslanders who fought in the Great War": WARNE, Frank Harry. Lance-Corporal, No. 4538. Born and educated at Witta. The son of Frederick and Charlotte Alma Warne, of Hollybush, Witta, via Maleny. Enlisted 15th October, 1915, and left Brisbane with 26th Battn. on troopship "Star of Victoria". Landed in Egypt, and from there on to France. Went into action at Pozieres, through Fleurs, Bullecourt, Villiers Brettoneaux, Dernacourt. Wounded at Pozieres, through Fleurs, Lagnicourt, and was gassed on 11th August, 1918, at Dernacourt. Sailed per "Ceramic" from England for Australia 9th August, 1919, and was discharged on 26th November, 1919, in Brisbane.
