## Witta School

The Witta School opened as the Maleny Provisional School on 3 October 1892 and was the second school on the range. The first Head teacher was Mr Carl Thiedecke who opened the school with 17 pupils. In 1893 the name was changed to the Teutoberg Provisional School and in 1916 became the Teutoberg State School. In 1916 it became known as the Witta State School.

The first building was made of pit-sawn logs with a hand split shingle roof, which also doubled as the Post Office. The mail was bough from Landsborough by packhorse weekly. In 1974, student numbers had dwindled to 7, so the school was closed and the remaining students were bussed into the Maleny State School. 696 students were enrolled at the school during the 82 years that the school was open. The school has been retained and today is today is a community facility


